Welcome back after the Christmas break.

Curriculum

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage, concentrating on the seven areas of learning. These include the Prime Areas of Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Communication and Language, and Physical Development. Also, the specific areas of Literacy, Mathematics, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. We plan daily so that we are able to follow your child's interests.

This term the children have already joined in with different snow activities. We will also be enjoying imaginative and malleable play, activities, supporting oral health, maths, and celebrating Chinese New Year and Valentine's Day.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Outdoor Play

As the weather has now turned much colder, please ensure that your child has adequate clothes, including a named coat, hat, scarf, and gloves.

If your child arrives at Pre-school in wellingtons, please also bring a pair of shoes for them to change into whilst indoors.

Absence from Pre-school

If your child is not going to be in Pre-school, please remember to call us on 02036097557 or email <u>parksidepreschoole4@gmail.com</u> to report the absence, with a reason. Please do this before 9.30am (or 1.00pm for afternoon sessions). If we have not heard from you, we will have to start calling those on your contact list

Just a reminder to everyone, if your child has a temperature or diarrhoea and vomiting, it is our policy that they must be kept at home for 48 hours from the last time they had a temperature, or an episode of vomiting or diarrhoea.

Government Help with Childcare Costs

Details of Government help with childcare, including "Tax-free childcare" and "30 hours free childcare" for 3 and 4-year-olds can be found on this website: https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/. Both are aimed at working families so check now to see if you could be eligible. Parkside Preschool is registered for the tax-free childcare, and you can find us if you are registering, by either our name, post code (E4 6XQ) or Ofsted URN (146927).

Two-year-old children of most working families, as well as those receiving certain Government support, are eligible for 15 hours of free childcare from the term after their second birthday.

Eligibility codes for working families are available via the Childcare Choices website (see above), you will need to have applied and provided us with the code by the end of the term before the funding starts. The scheme will be expanding to 30-hours for children of working families from 9-months old in September 2025 and you can register to receive the latest updates on the same website.

Queueing

Please could parents and carers remember to queue in one line along the fence when dropping off, not only is it safer but it allows the person on the door to register the children more easily.

Flu Vaccination

Flu vaccinations (in the form of a nasal spray) are available from your GP for all children who were aged two or three on 31 August 2024 and are particularly important this year. Vaccines are also available for primary school age children and those aged 6 months to 2 years with a long-term health condition.

You should also check that your child is up-to-date with their MMR vaccinations.


